MALVERN SPRING SHOW, 9-12 May

DEADHEAD SPRING BULBS Spend some time pinching out the flower heads off daffodills that gone over. Taking the heads off means that all the plant's energy is drawn down to the bulb as the foliage dies back, rather than making seed. You dont need remove all the stalk.

RHUBARB Rhubarb plants should now be in full growth. Water the clump regularly to keep it in growth.

SARAH RAVEN - RHUBARB AND GINGER VODKA

Makes a fragrant drink with tonic or served over ice with lemonade.

Makes 750ml

500g pink rhubarb cut into chunks

250g caster sugar

4cm piece of fresh ginger peeled and sliced

Peel from 2 oranges

1x 750 ml vodka

Put cleaned and chopped rhubarb, sugar, ginger and peel from oranges in kilner, or similar jar. Add vodka and keep for one month. Turn regularly. Strain and bottle.
