FINANCE Our bank balance as at 12th August is £3656.03.

Lucienne Bennett's talk on Tulips in June cost £230; and our garden visit to Ryton in July cost £256 for transport and £150 admission. The £256 includes an annual Hub membership fee of £20.

The Parish Council has confirmed that our hire charges for the hall are not increasing.

COFFEE MORNING We have received several additional donations towards our coffee morning fund raising event, bringing the total to a magnificent £754.84. Well done everyone, and thank you for your donations and attendance. The money goes into our funds and will be used towards speaker and transport costs for the rest of the year.

NORTHERN LITHIUM Northern Lithium is a privately owned UK mineral exploration and development company established in 2017. The focus is on delivering a domestic supply of lithium - a critical mineral essential for the production of lithium-ion batteries and electric vehicles in the UK. Their initial project is located across large areas of Weardale and is exploring known lithium in brine mineral reserves deep within the underlying granite. The company started drilling at Ludwell Farm, Eastgate, in 2022.

Over the past two years Northern Lithium have supported several local initiatives in the immediate vicinity of Eastgate and Westgate. Their Shared Prosperity Fund has been extended to support good causes and community groups within the parishes of Wolsingham and Stanhope and surrounding villages. The fund is administered by an independent assessment panel who assess all grant applications against set criteria.

As a leading community group in Weardale, we made application for funding to support

our ongoing activities and we are absolutely delighted that we have been awarded £800. We are most grateful to Northern Lithium, and well done, and thank you, to our own finance specialists - Christine - our Treasurer, and Alison.

SARAH RAVEN'S AUTUMN RECIPE - QUICK RHUBARB CHUTNEY WITH CARDAMOM

200ml cider vinegar; 400g soft light brown sugar; 100g raisins; 2 chopped red onions; 2cm piece of ginger, chopped; seeds from 20 cardamom pods; 4 star anise; grated zest of 1 lemon; 1 teasp salt; 1kg rhubarb cut into 3 cm chunks.

Put all ingredients except rhubarb into preserving pan and bring to boil; boil for 5 mins. Add rhubarb and bring back to boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 15 mins, stirring occasionally.

Cool slightly and spoon into prepared jars. Once opened best kept in the fridge; keeps for up to a month.
